RE: FY 2018 – Replacement Vehicles

We are requesting a new full-size pick-up truck to replace an existing 2007 Ford F150. This vehicle is utilized by the Maintenance Technician. The existing vehicle has only 105,925 miles; however, we have spent \$4,150.00 in repairs to the vehicle in FY 15-16 and the first half of FY 16-17 combined.

With the exception of the Maintenance Supervisor, the department has tried to meet its vehicle needs by utilizing surplus vehicles from the Sheriff's Department, Fire & Rescue, and Public Works. Many of these vehicles have had very high mileage, in some instances over 200,000 miles, and were in need of significant repairs. We are seeking this vehicle as a more cost effective and long-term means to meet the department's vehicle needs.

The estimated cost of the vehicle is just that an estimation. The figure was derived based upon the purchase price of the Maintenance Supervisor's truck, which was acquired July 29, 2015 with some increase in price over the two year time frame. The budget request is \$35,000.00; however, we believe we can acquire the replacement for \$30,000.00

At the Board of Supervisors Budget Worksession this morning, the following information was requested regarding REPLACEMENT vehicles that have been included in your department's FY 2018 budget request:

I hope this is what you looking for...

Reason for vehicle request(s)

We are requesting 31 vehicles. 19 of the vehicles requested already have excessive mileage. Vehicles average between 25,000 and 30,000 miles a year. There was a time under Mr. Riley that there was an understanding to replace 25 vehicles a year but then the economy took a turn and it wasn't done at that point.

12 of the vehicles will be to fill the new positions, depending on the amount provided by the Board of Supervisors.

1 of the vehicles requested would be for an Animal Control Unit.

Price quote for requested replacement vehicle(s)

I would like to split the order upon the acceptance of manpower or vehicle purchase approval. This would split between the Taurus and the Explorer.

The cost of the Ford Taurus Interceptors, on State Contract are \$25,756.00 with \$11,173.00 to equip them with lights, siren, cage, radio, computer, gun racks etc.

The cost of the Ford Explorer Interceptor on State Contract is \$28,944.00 with \$11,173.00 to equip them with lights, siren, cage, radio, computer, gun racks etc.

The cost of the Ford F-150 on State Contract is \$29,656.00 with \$10,300.00 to equip them with lights, siren, radio, computer, gun racks etc. no cage is required, because we don't do transports in an ACO vehicle of prisoners.

- Condition of vehicle(s) being replaced
 - Replace vehicles with high mileage.
 - Historically with the maintenance costs of vehicles after all warranties have expired, the
 cost of maintaining the agency vehicle increases as the vehicle ages because of major
 engine, transmission, and suspension issues.

3. This budget year the department has requested 14 Ford Interceptors SUV style vehicles. The Department still has 7 SUV style vehicles in the fleet. Historically the maintenance cost for the SUV vs. the Sedan type police cars, the SUV is cheaper to maintain.

Because of vehicle designs and Deputies that exceed 6 foot 2 in height the agency needs more SUV style vehicles so our bigger officers can enter and exit the vehicle easier and have access to their weapon while inside the unit. This also gives the taller deputies enough head and leg room to operate the vehicle safely. Taller deputies struggle to get in and out of their vehicles. This was not a problem with Ford Crown Victoria police vehicles, however they have be discontinued from production by manufacturer due to issues with rollover safety.

Justifications for Replacement Vehicles 3505-8005-000 - Motor Vehicle and Equipment

Frederick County Fire and Rescue is requesting to replace three vehicles in the department. All prices quoted were obtained from current EVA contract listings. Due to the nature of Fire and Rescue, heavier vehicles are necessary in order to haul gear and equipment, tools, EMS supplies, turnout gear and air packs and necessary command equipment needed on emergency scenes. The Department must also have vehicles with towing capabilities due to the numerous trailers we utilize for training, investigations and public education.

2017 or newer Chevy Tahoe Command Vehicle (Replacement for TR-10) \$37,000.

We would like to purchase a 2017 Chevrolet Tahoe to **replace** the current Training 10, which is a 2013 Chevrolet Tahoe with over 124,000 miles at this time. The vehicle is used every day, Monday through Friday, for many work related tasks, including responding to incidents and normal day-to-day operations. Training-10 plays a crucial role in the Incident Command System function for all of Frederick County. The increased mileage on the vehicle has caused wear on the vehicle in the drive train and other mechanical systems. Nearly all the mileage on this vehicle was through emergency operations, which unlike regular wear and tear decrease the number of years the vehicle can be utilized. The interior and body of the vehicle are both in good condition. Replacing this vehicle now will help alleviate the vehicle becoming a maintenance nightmare and a financial burden on the department and will allow the department to have a back-up vehicle when other first-line command vehicles are in need of maintenance. This vehicle would also be available during high incident volume times, such as during major winter storms to help manage the multitude of incidents.

2017 or newer Ford F-250 3/4 Ton Crew Cab 4WD Pickups (Replacement TR10-1 (\$31,000) We would like to **replace** the 2006 Chevrolet Silverado Pickup assigned to one of the Training Division Lieutenants. This vehicle is utilized in the Training Division to move training related trailers from one location to another. In addition, we use it to transport personnel during certain training exercises and for hauling supplies necessary to the mission of the training division.

The vehicle is currently entering its eleventh year in the fleet. The vehicle currently has 96,735 miles. We expect to reach 110,000 miles by summer. The transmission was recently replaced as the old transmission was no longer engaging properly from the rigors of pulling trailers. Brakes also seem to be wearing faster and the roof is starting to rust because the paint has peeled off. The seat covering has a large hole worn in it from drivers entering and exiting the vehicle.

The Ford F-250 is requested due to its ability to tow the trailers that we utilize in the training division. The crew cab is necessary for the personnel we transport and a pick-up body is desirable because of the oversized materials we often use during training. In addition, the truck body allows us to keep gear recently used in training burn exercises out of the cab when we return home thus reducing our exposure to possible carcinogenic materials.

2017 or newer Ford F250 Crew Cab 4WD Pick-Up Truck \$31,000 (Replacement FM10-6) We are requesting to **replace** the 2004 Chevrolet Tahoe assigned to our Fire Inspector/Public Education Specialist. The current vehicle is 13 years old currently has 159,861 miles. This

vehicle's maintenance costs and issues have continuously increased, most recently having the exhaust system deteriorate and brake failure, resulting in both being repaired and replaced.

The requested vehicle will meet the significant need for more storage of fire prevention supplies and props (i.e., fire extinguisher prop, fire extinguishers, and other public education materials that are unable to fit in his current vehicle) and the needed towing capabilities for department trailers, while maintaining separation of firefighting personal protective equipment and potential known carcinogen materials.

Replacement of Engine 10 is necessary at a projected total cost of \$200,000.

We are requesting to purchase a replacement to the aging Engine 10. Through Government Surplus, we will likely be able to purchase a used Engine for \$200,000. The Department was fortunate in 2007 to purchase the current Engine for \$1.00 (a 1986 Pierce Arrow pumper from the Fairfax Volunteer Fire Department) to support training programs. During the past eight years, this pumper has not only been utilized for education and training purposes, but has also been utilized as a reserve pumper by all of the volunteer fire and rescue companies. During the past year, the practice of loaning this pumper to any of the volunteer fire and rescue companies has stopped due to the amount of mechanical problems and associated repairs that have evolved with this aging piece of apparatus.

The Training Division has always had good working relationships with the individual volunteer fire and rescue companies in Frederick County and Winchester to utilize apparatus for training programs. During recent years, the volunteer apparatus is getting harder to obtain due to increased incident responses, frequency of apparatus being out-of-service, or the lack of volunteer drivers to bring specialty apparatus to the respective class location outside of Frederick County. The various certifying agencies have adopted apparatus requirements for these training programs and in order to be able to facilitate them we must have the required type of apparatus available for the respective class sessions.

The National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) recommends that apparatus be removed from service after 25-years based upon aging vehicle components and availability of parts, amount of funding required to continue to make the vehicle roadworthy, and general design features and construction. It is imperative that we have an operational pumper to utilize for training programs offered and facilitated by the Training Division. It is not conducive for our fire and rescue system to take functional apparatus out-of-service for training purposes.

The Public Works Department has proposed to purchase four (4) vehicles in the FY 2018 budget year. We have provided the requested information below in brief summaries for each vehicle listed by individual departments.

Building Inspections Department

Line Item: 10-3401-8005-00

We have proposed to replace a 2005 GMC Canyon with over 120,000 that is in fair condition. Based on current average mileage for our Inspectors, the vehicle will have over 130,000 miles by the end of FY 2018.

Based on current quotes for a similar vehicle and anticipating cost increases for 2018 model years, we have proposed an amount of \$28,000 for a new 4x4 pickup.

Engineering Department

Line item: 10-4201-8005-00

We have proposed to replace a 2004 Dodge Dakota 4x4 pickup that is currently driven by our Project Manager. The mileage for this vehicle is approximately 110,000 and the vehicle is in fair condition. We have recently had to perform some repairs on the vehicle due to suspension issues from the continual use on rough terrain. The job responsibilities for the Project Manger require him to access new project sites (i.e. new roads, buildings, etc.) during construction. The jobsites have very rough terrain and are usually large in size requiring him to access remote locations of project when there are no roads or access points.

Additional information for proposed new vehicles in FY 2018 budget Page 2 January 24, 2017

We are proposing to replace this vehicle with a new Half-ton 4x4 pickup truck. We went on the eVa website and obtained a quote for a similar vehicle for \$28,600. We have budgeted an amount of \$30,000 since we would be purchasing a 2018 model year.

Landfill Budget

Line item: 12-4204-8005-00

We are proposing to replace two (2) vehicles in the FY 2018 budget at the landfill. I have provided a summary for each vehicle.

- 1. We have proposed to replace the existing Litter Buggy truck. The current vehicle is a 1999 F350 4x4 dump truck with a hydraulic lift gate. It is currently used at the landfill site and at the convenience sites around the County to remove large bulky items. The vehicle has over 107,000 miles and is in poor condition. We proposed a budget amount of \$60,000. Due to the specialized equipment on the truck and proposed cost, we intend to solicit bids for this vehicle.
- 2. We have proposed to replace the 2002 Ford Explorer 4x4 SUV that is driven by the Director of Public Works. The current vehicle has over 130,00 miles and is in poor condition. We have had to perform many repairs on this vehicle in recent months due to its age and use. This vehicle accesses job sites and the landfill with rough terrain and poor site conditions. We have utilized the eVA website to determine a cost for a new 4x4 SUV and the current average cost is over \$28,000. We have estimated a budget amount of \$35,000 since we will be purchasing a 2018 model and costs will be high.

Reason for vehicle request: DSS sold two agency vehicles that were 19 and 17 years old at the sheriff's sale in September 2016. The staff was not using these two vehicles as they were not reliable and unsafe to transport clients in and employees would only use if no other vehicle was available and within the county limits. They both had under the 3000 miles driven per year and was determined it was not worth keeping. We were able to replace one of these vehicles in 2016 within our FY 16 budget and we are looking to replace the second vehicle that was sold in 2016 during the FY 2018 year. We also have another vehicle that is currently in the same shape as the two vehicles we sold last year and is currently only being used at last resort and short distances. It's a 1995 (22 years old) Ford Explorer and has over 181,000 miles on it. We kept it from the sale last year because agency could not afford to let 3 vehicles go at once with no immediate replacement. If we are approved a new vehicle we would consider junking this vehicle which still in turn keeps us down one vehicle.

<u>Price Quote of replacement vehicle:</u> We would like another small SUV like our recent purchase of a Jeep Compass, that vehicle was \$20,100. We would try to find another similar vehicle and at least \$25,000 or lower.

<u>Condition of vehicle being replaced:</u> The vehicle we are replacing has already been junked and sold at the sheriff's sale in September 2016. We also have another current vehicle that is 22 years old, 181,000 miles on it and unsafe to drive any distance or with clients in.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING Between

Frederick County

And

Youth Development Center

In an effort to provide quality recreational programs for teens, it is beneficial for Frederick County to provide financial assistance to the Youth Development Center (YDC). This Memorandum of Understanding outlines the expectations and outcomes required by Frederick County for such financial assistance.

FREDERICK COUNTY will provide the YDC an annual contribution based on the number of Frederick County youth who utilize the YDC facility. Frederick County will provide based on the prior years tracked attendance \$1.25 per Frederick County youth who utilized the YDC facility not to exceed \$25,000 per year. This contribution is based on funding in the general budget. Should the general budget, or Frederick County Parks and Recreation's (FCPRD) operating budget be reduced, the contribution may be reduced.

<u>YDC</u> will provide various teen programs including drop-in style programming for area teens and pre-teens. This programming should not duplicate programming efforts of FCPRD. When significant duplication is recognized, both the YDC and FCPRD will make arrangements and cooperatively eliminate such duplication.

YDC, annually by September 15, will provide FCPRD the number of Frederick County youth that visited their facility in the most recently concluded season, September 1- August 31. This report is to be provided annually and will be furnished to FCPRD by YDC.

YDC will provide FCPRD the most current bylaws, policies and procedures, and most recently filed 990 with the IRS by September 15 annually.

YDC will ensure all employees and volunteers who are 18 years or older must pass a criminal background screening for the attached standards.

<u>FCPRD</u> will review the submitted annual report and calculate the annual contribution based on the reported Frederick County youth attendance. This annual contribution will be included in the FCPRD's annual budget request if all the above requirements are met.

Each organization reserves the right to terminate this memorandum of understanding at any time. The terminating agency will notify the other agency by written correspondence of such.

This project will target the underserved and/or at risk population (which is the entire community) between the ages of 0-110 and will provide extensive education of the dangers of prescription drug abuse and its link to the heroin epidemic that our community is facing. This program will also establish the connection between prescription drug abuse and addiction, the importance of monitoring and securing all medications in the homes, and the safe disposal of prescription medications when no longer in use.
