The Community Policy and Management Team (CPMT) met in the 1st Floor Conference Room at 107 N Kent St, Winchester, VA 22601, on March 27, 2023, at 1:00 pm.

Call to Order: Denise Acker called the meeting to order at 1:07 pm.

Introductions: None

Adoption of Agenda: Jay Tibbs made a motion to adopt the March agenda; David Alley seconded; CPMT approved.

Consent Agenda: The following items were included in the Consent Agenda for CPMT's approval:

- February 27, 2023- CPMT Minutes. Jerry Stollings made a motion to approve the February minutes; David Alley seconded, Leea Shirley abstained, CPMT approved.
- Budget Request Forms- Confidential Under HIPAA. Jerry Stollings made a motion to accept the Budget Request Forms, David Alley seconded, CPMT approved.

Executive Session:

None

Committee Member Announcements:

- Jerry Stollings stated that he plans to offer the CSU Supervisor position to an applicant by the end of the week.
- Denise Acker reported that the NWCSB Executive Director position has not been filled.
- Leea Shirley reported that the Health Department Director position has not been filled.

CSA Office Business:

- CSA Financial Report
- February 2023 Financial Report

- Monthly Net Expenditures-\$321,418.97 or 9% of the allocation, including Protected and SpEd WrapAround Funds.
- Year to Date Net Expenditures-\$2,183,562.23 or 61% of the allocation, including Protected and SpEd WrapAround Funds. The local match is \$838,067.91.
- Remaining funds without Wrap-\$1,382,359.07 or 39% of the total allocation.
- Protected Funds- \$21,239.50 spent, \$22,217.50 remaining, with no funds currently encumbered.
- SpEd Wrap Funds: \$57,103.30 spent, \$42,896.69 remaining, with \$23,420.00 encumbered.
- Youth Served: 113 youths.
 - 71 in Community Based Services
 - 16 in Private Day School
 - 19 in Congregate Care
 - 23 in TFC
- UR/CQI Specialist Vacancy- Katherine Webster has accepted the UR/CQI position and will begin on April 17, 2023. Katherine is currently the CSA Coordinator in Clarke County and has good knowledge of Frederick County's CSA Program.
- Committee Vacancy Recruitment- CPMT discussed an application for a Private Provider Representative on FAPT. The applicant recently notified the CSA Coordinator of her plans to accept a position with a different agency which does not serve Frederick County. CPMT noted that the position is meant for a private provider that serves the local community.

Old Business:

- Audit Discussion
 - o Item #1 CANS- The CSA Coordinator started a Lunch & Learn Spring 2023 series to provide CSA support to case managers in the area of CSA documentation. These Lunch & Learn series will be planned approximately twice per year on various topics including policies, CANS, etc. The next task on the QIP is the creation of a robust training plan for all stakeholders associated with CSA identifying who should require training and which training is appropriate based on the stakeholder's role. The date of completion for this plan is June.
 - o Item #2 FAPT Policy and Procedure Change- Complete
 - o Item # 3 Copayment-
 - Work is in progress to determine resources needed to manage copayments internally and what the workflow might be for collecting copayments.
 - Discussion was initiated to identify whose income would be included in the assessment. CPMT suggested that copay procedures from other localities be reviewed to aid in the policy revision.
- CSA Program Improvement Update-
 - David Alley reported that 2 focus groups have been completed with the third one scheduled for March 30, 2023. Both meetings were similar and contained positive interactions with good feedback. The results will be compiled into a report that will be shared with CPMT.
- Legislative updates-

- SB 1513- this bill adds the Director of DARS to the SEC and a DARS representative to SLAT. This bill passed the House and Senate and is waiting on the governor's signature.
- HB 1945- This bill has been signed by the governor. The bill removes the requirement of FAPT and CPMT to report to DBHDS the youth who were hospitalized and could not obtain placement to a PRTF or Inpatient facility within a specified number of days.
- Companion Bills presented in the House and Senate to dismiss the implementation of the standardized private day school rates are still in process. This bill will also contain a requirement that OCS provide technical assistance for localities where Private Day Placements are overused.

New Business:

- CSA Eligibility Discussion- CPMT discussed their interpretation of the Child in Need of Services criteria for foster care prevention specifically regarding the determination of a "serious threat to the well-being and physical safety of the child." CPMT recommended that OCS be contacted for their guidance from an auditing perspective and return for discussion next month.
- Administrative Memo #23-02- Memo from OCS of plans to reclaim SpEd funds from localities who have not used them and redistribute to other localities requesting additional funds.
- Administrative Memo #23-03- Localities were notified that VDSS suspended the requirement
 for implementation and use of IV-E QRTP approved programs for youth in foster care. IV-E
 youth were eligible for reimbursement of Room & Board and Additional Daily Supervision
 costs in QRTP approved TGHs and CFRs. Frederick County CPMT has 1 case that met
 criteria, which will now shift to CSA funding.

Informational Items:

2022 CSA Outcome Report- OCS is mandated to report annually on statewide
performance using data collected from the CANS, locality dataset submissions, and other
agencies' outcome measures. Specifically, OCS is directed to provide outcome data
regarding permanency by VDSS, recidivism under DJJ, and education through VDOE.
The SEC identified 6 indicator points to address meet this requirement. The 2022 report
represents the fifth year of data collection, allowing for that many years of comparison.

Assigned Tasks:

- The CSA Coordinator will continue to address the tasks identified in the Quality Improvement Plan.
- The CSA Coordinator will collect policies and sliding fee scales related to copayments to review at the next CPMT meeting.
- The CSA Coordinator will seek written guidance from OCS regarding the interpretation of, "serious threat to the wellbeing and physical safety" language of the CHINS Services eligibility criteria.

Next Meeting: The next CPMT meeting will be held Monday, April 24, 2023, at 1:00 pm in the 1st Floor Conference Room.

Adjournment: Leea Shirley made a motion to adjourn, David Alley seconded; the motion was approved. The meeting adjourned at 2:35 pm.







Monthly Net Expenditures




Placement Environment





Dear Vendor,

Once again, the Frederick County Community Policy and Management Team (CPMT) is beginning the contract renewal process with our network of providers for services to at-risk youth and families funded through the Children's Services Act (CSA). Several changes have been made in the CSA office to improve efficiency, communication, and service delivery.

First, new emails have been established to provide more consistency. Moving forward, please email all correspondence regarding contracts to CSAContracts@fcva.us. All communication regarding Purchase Orders, Invoices, Payments, or Billing should be sent to CSAInvoices@fcva.us. These mailboxes will be monitored by multiple people, allowing for a faster response and improved access to information.

Additionally, the CSA Office has added a Utilization Review/Continuous Quality Improvement (UR/CQI) Specialist to their staff. This position will focus on ensuring our youth and their families receive services in the least restrictive, clinically effective and cost-efficient manner.

The past several years have been challenging to everyone. Depression, anxiety, suicide, and the use of Fentanyl among our youth population is on the rise and has likely touched each one of us in some way. Providers of mental health, behavioral health, and substance abuse services have struggled to hire and fill staff vacancies, while the needs of our youth and families have increased significantly. Waitlists for services to help the youth and families in our community are longer than ever, further stressing the situation.

The Commonwealth of Virginia implemented the 988 call line as a "no wrong door" access to mental health support. They've also worked with Medicaid, although still in its infancy, to increase access to crisis services across the state. I'm proud of our community for stepping up to take on that challenge.

Each year I take this opportunity to express my appreciation for your commitment to our community and partnership to tackle the issues that Frederick County youth face. This year, I feel especially grateful to have had an opportunity to work with your agency. Knowing the struggles that each of you faced while being committed and willing to work with the complex needs of our youth. Whether it's a potential referral, or your willingness to hang on a few weeks longer so a foster care youth could graduate, please know that your efforts have not gone unnoticed by Frederick County CPMT.

For the upcoming fiscal year, Frederick County would, once again, like to utilize the renewal option in the FY22 Agreement for Purchase of Services, allowable until June 30, 2024.

Approved contract renewals shall include the attached signed FY24 Contract Renewal Agreement, FY22 Agreement for Purchase of Services and Addenda, FY23 Contract Renewal Amendments, FY24 Rate Sheet, and Rate Justification (if increased from prior year). The renewal period will be from July 1, 2023-June 30, 2024. If no rate increase is requested, your contract will automatically be renewed once all documentation is received by the CSA office.

In order to guarantee purchase orders are issued for services continuing beyond June 30, 2023, and to avoid any breaks in service, please promptly submit the following:

- Signed FY24 Renewal Agreement
- Completed FY24 CSA Provider Information Sheet
- FY24 Rate Sheet
- Current valid License
- <u>Current Certificate of Insurance showing Frederick County CPMT as additional insured</u>

All contract documentation should be emailed to CSAContracts@fcva.us and must be received by May 31, 2023. Incomplete renewals or those received after May 31, 2023, may experience delayed processing, resulting in maintaining current FY23 contract and rates on a month to month basis until processing can be completed. I encourage you to electronically sign and return these documents via email to expedite this process. Once validated and accepted, you will receive a signed copy of the renewal agreement.

Subject: Annual CSA Service Gap Survey

Section 2.2-5211.1.2 of the Code of Virginia requires that: "The community policy and management team shall report annually to the Office of Children's Services on the gaps in services needed to keep children in the local community and any barriers to the development of those services." This requirement led to the implementation of the annual CSA Service Gap Survey, which has been in place since 2007. The Survey can also serve as a resource to local CSA programs in meeting the language of §2.2-5206.4 that each CPMT shall: "Coordinate long-range, community-wide planning that ensures the development of resources and services needed by children and families in its community ..."

The Office of Children's Services is via this Administrative Memorandum, issuing the 2023 CSA Service Gap Survey and requests your careful attention.
