Title County Administrator

Brief Project Description: (IF NOT COMPLETE, APPLICATION IS DISQUALIFIED)

The Frederick County Fire and Rescue Department is proposing to purchase tablet style computers similar to the Panasonic H-2 Toughbook and Firehouse Mobile EMS Software for each of the EMS licensed vehicles within the county. This request includes 22 ambulances and 6 response vehicles. The hardware will include the computer, vehicular docking station, external antenna for each vehicle, and 2 docking stations for the hospital. The purchase of mobile computers and software will enhance the capabilities of the licensed EMS Agencies in the jurisdiction to compile, print, and transfer patient care reports to the receiving facility and the Virginia Office of Emergency Medical Services Reporting System. Other uses include transmittal of 12-Lead ECG to the receiving facility, the use of GPS to locate incidents and potential landing zones for zones for medical helicopters; and utilization of electronic protocols and other reference materials that are currently readily available.

Project/Equipment Sustainability: (IF NOT COMPLETE, APPLICATION IS DISOUALIFIED)

(How does your agency propose to sustain this project/equipment after funding is complete?)

The Frederick County Fire and Rescue Department projects that these computers will have a minimum life span of 5 years and the price quote reflects a five year warranty plan. The Information Technologies (IT) Department will support all of the computers by maintaining Virus and Firewall Protection on the computers through the County Government contract. The Department currently has licenses with Firehouse Software to support program management and maintains a Service Agreement for maintenance and system upgrades. Because of technology advancements, it is impossible to predict our needs past the 5 year life expectancy of this equipment.

Virginia Rescue Squad Assistance Fund Grant Narrative Frederick County Fire and Rescue Department March 15, 2012

Scope of Request

The purpose of this grant request is to provide hardware and software needed to institute mobile data collection of patient care data for EMS incidents occurring in Frederick County, Virginia. The purchase of this hardware/software will allow the Department to more efficiently collect data in the field and complete the reporting requirements of various state agencies, including the Virginia Office of Emergency Medical Services (VOEMS). In addition to improving incident reporting capabilities, the new hardware will allow all EMS vehicles to initiate transmission of 12-Lead ECG's to the receiving facility, allow for use of electronic and/or on-line reference materials, and utilize GPS in conjunction with computer aided dispatch to improve response times for responding units.

EMS response within Frederick County is provided by eleven (11) volunteer EMS agencies supported by career staffing of the Frederick County Fire and Rescue Department. All transport units are owned by the various volunteer agencies and are normally operated by career staff located within the volunteer stations. The Department does operate several ALS non-transport vehicles which provide ALS coverage to the more rural regions of the County. Because of the integration of career and volunteer personnel in our operational system, the Department coordinates and submits incident response data for each of the volunteer agencies as well as for career responses. The Department is a multi-faceted department which provides EMS response, fire suppression, rescue and hazardous materials response, and requires a robust data management system to manage its data. The data management system that is currently used provides EMS and NFIRS reporting; manages personnel and training records; and tracts preplan, inspections, and investigations information. Firehouse Software provides our current data management system, but our current capabilities only allow the department to provide data entry at the fire station or at the local hospital. We are currently not able to capture data in the field real time, but desire to do so. With the latest changes to EMS patient care reporting generated by the migration to NEMESIS Version 3, a reevaluation of the current software package is necessary. The new software package would include mobile reporting capabilities.

Several options are available for patient care reporting, including the free version of software from Image Trend that is provided through the Virginia Office of EMS and various other third party vendors. Our desire is to utilize a software vendor that provides data collection that is integrated to minimize the need of duplicate data entry. This requires us to consider third party vendors, since the "freeware" does not meet all of our data collection needs. Many of the software vendors which are currently NEMESIS compliant and meet the current VOEMS specifications for data submission are in the process of updating their software to meet Version 3 compliance. It is impossible at this time to compare the products of the various vendors as they do not have updated products available to evaluate. For the purposes of this application, we have received a price quote from Firehouse Software as our software provider. The vendor has assured us that their product will be NEMESIS and Virginia compliant, but upon completion of our evaluation of the product we may determine that a competitor's product (such as Image Trend) may provide a better solution. The Department would be responsible for any additional funding necessary to change software vendors.

The proposed hardware is the H2 Panasonic Toughbook computer. This tablet computer was chosen for several reasons including its history of reliability when operated in hostile environments, ergonomics and size, and desirable features including the ability to visualize the screen in various lighting conditions. The proposed computer includes a Gobi integrated wireless card which is compatible with various wireless networks located within the jurisdiction. Availability of wireless service within the area is dependent on the provider used. Having a wireless card that will operate on various networks will allow the Department to pick and choose wireless providers whose service area provides the best coverage. It also allows the Department to pick and choose wireless plans which provide the most cost effective options.

Another option that is requested is an integrated GPS capability. The availability of GPS allows the Department to dispatch the closest available crew to an incident based upon their physical location, rather than the location of their station. This will result in reduced response times to incidents. Additional advantages include the ability to locate potential landing site locations by their latitude and longitude, and the ability to locate lost or stolen or misplaced computers.

The unit cost of each computer includes the cost of a vehicle docking station, screen protector, and five (5) year warranty. The cost of installing the computers within the vehicles is not included and will be performed in house to minimize cost. Two (2) docking stations for use at the receiving facility are also included. These docking stations would be used to print patient care reports at the facility.

Budget

Our proposal includes the following items:

Financial Need and Sustaining of Project

Frederick County Fire and Rescue Department has operated on level funding for the last four years. The Department has been unable to make capital purchases, including needed vehicle replacements. Our operating costs have increased primarily due to increased fuel prices and vehicle maintenance costs; yet our operating budget for the current year was actually reduced from the previous year, and with the prospect of no tax increases for the next fiscal year, the probability of local tax dollars supporting any new projects is minimal. Local funding to the volunteer agencies has also been reduced and funding for capital purchases by those agencies has been eliminated as well. When the NEMESIS data reporting was instituted and VOEMS initiated reporting using Image Trend, Frederick County requested Laptop computers for each of its EMS vehicles. Unfortunately, the request was unfunded at that time. The funding for that initiative was provided at 100%. We are requesting the same consideration.

The Department is currently investigating the feasibility of fee for service (EMS billing). It is anticipated that revenue from EMS billing would cover the cost of sustaining this project after the initial year of implementation, but that money will not be available until late 2013. Seed money is necessary to implement this project and meet the timeline proposed by VOEMS to be able to meet the new reporting requirements resulting from transition to NEMESIS Version 3. Our Information Technologies (IT) Department would manage virus protection, connectivity issues and non-warranty repairs. The five year warranty should cover any major repair costs to hardware. The cost of maintaining the software, which is estimated at approximately 25,000.00 annually, would be borne by the Department using revenue from EMS billing.
