**RESOLUTION TO ADOPT AN AMENDMENT TO THE
2030 COMPREHENSIVE PLAN,
CHAPTER VI, PUBLIC FACILITIES – FREDERICK COUNTY
GOVERNMENT SERVICES**

WHEREAS, The 2030 Comprehensive Plan, The Plan, was adopted by the Board of Supervisors on July 14, 2011; and

WHEREAS, this amendment, adding the section Frederick County Government Services including a policy to improve services to citizens through the efficient and effective provision of community facilities, is a follow up to and in support of the discussion of the Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) and proposed joint County Administration Facilities to be located generally in the County's Urban Development Area (UDA) or Sewer and Water Service Area (SWSA); and

WHEREAS, the Frederick County Planning Commission held a public hearing on this proposed amendment on March 5, 2014 and recommended approval; and

WHEREAS, the Frederick County Board of Supervisors held a public hearing on this proposed amendment on April 9, 2014; and


WHEREAS, the Frederick County Board of Supervisors finds that the adoption of this amendment to the 2030 Comprehensive Plan, Chapter VI, Public Facilities – Frederick County Government Services, to be in the best interest of the public health, safety, welfare and future of Frederick County, and in good planning practice; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Frederick County Board of Supervisors that **THE AMENDMENT TO THE 2030 COMPREHENSIVE PLAN, CHAPTER VI, PUBLIC FACILITIES – FREDERICK COUNTY GOVERNMENT SERVICES**, is adopted. This amendment continues to promote Frederick County government and its effort to provide accessible, effective and high quality government services to its citizens, business owners and community partners.
