This is a request for a recommendation to the Board of Supervisors from the Finance Committee on behalf of S&W Tours for a commitment to matching funds in the amount of \$16,000.00 for a Virginia Department of Rail and Public Transit grant.

S&W is seeking this grant to add a bus or buses to their existing fleet of two commuter buses which are based out of the Front Royal area park and ride lots. This new bus or buses would be based out of the Clarke County park and ride lot and would be offering commuter service to the Northern Virginia area.

Five localities in addition to Frederick County are being asked for similar commitments in efforts to reach a goal of \$96,000.00 in matching funds and \$96,000.00 in grant funds, for a total of \$192,000.00. These localities include Winchester, Clarke County, Warren County, Shenandoah County, and Page County.

S&W's goal is to sell advertising on their existing and new buses to either supplement or replace the obligation of the localities, depending upon how things develop in terms of how many localities provide matching funds and how successful advertising sales are.

The requestor's grant application is due February 1, 2008, so there is no opportunity to table this item for further consideration since the Board will need to act before that time.

On July 1st, 2007, the Frederick County Fire and Rescue Department received notification from the Office of Emergency Medical Services that our agency has been awarded funding from the OEMS Consolidated Grants Program. The total grant amount awarded was \$44,384.04. This is a 50% matching grant with 50 percent being funded by the State and 50% being funded by the local jurisdiction. The department has within its budget the 50% matching funds for the local jurisdiction.

It is at this time that I request a supplemental appropriation in the amount of \$44,384.04 from the general fund. The approval would allow for the purchase of 75 P25 Digital Portable Radios under the grant. Upon receipt of these items and payment, the department will submit for reimbursement of the awarded 50% match from the State, which would be placed back into the general fund with no expense to the County.

Following-up on the Committee's discussions at your December 19, 2007 meeting regarding the acceptance and use of cash proffers exclusively for capital expenditures, staff drafted a policy in an effort to comply with the wording and intent of the Virginia State Code.

Proposed Cash Proffer Procedure

Proffered funds received by the County will be held for the use of the specified department or agency for which the funds were originally proffered. In the case of funds proffered to offset impacts to fire and rescue services, the funds will be earmarked for the company located in closest proximity to the subject rezoning. Funds will be collected, held, and will accumulate until such time as a capital project funding request is received from the relevant department or agency.

Requests to utilize proffered funds would be submitted to the County's Finance Department for processing. The Finance Department will forward the requests to the Finance Committee for a recommendation to the Board of Supervisors. Requests to access proffered funds should specify the amount of funds requested and include a detailed description of the desired capital project/purchase, the total project cost, and indicate whether or not the item is listed on the County's Capital Improvements Plan (CIP). This process was discussed and agreed to by the Fire and Rescue Association's Proffer Committee.

Inclusion of Fire and Rescue Companies in the CIP

A second and parallel initiative was to set -up clear procedures for including desired capital projects or purchases of volunteer fire and rescue companies into the County's CIP. The process that had been discussed with, and agreed to by the Fire and Rescue Association was that beginning in 2008

the Planning and Development would include the County's Fire and Rescue Coordinator on the list of recipients of the CIP request packages. The Coordinator would then distribute copies of the packages to each Fire and Rescue Company to be completed and submit back to the Coordinator by the specified deadline. The Coordinator would then see that all the packages are delivered to the Planning Department for processing.

At the Finance Committee's December meeting a question was raised regarding the handling of requests to access proffered funds for capital expenditures that were *not* listed on the CIP. Specifically, the question was whether or not (in light of the wording in §15.2-2-2298 of the State Code) it would be necessary (or advisable) for the County to amend its CIP to include a requested item/project that was not already listed on the CIP, prior to proffered funds being appropriated for that project.

The relevant code section reads:

"In the event that proffered conditions include the dedication of real property or payment of cash, the property will not transfer and the payment of cash will not be made until the facilities for which the property is dedicated or cash is tendered are included in the capital improvement program, provided that nothing herein will prevent a locality from accepting proffered conditions which are not normally included in a capital improvement program."

Staff met with Mr. Mitchell and the Planning Director on January 3, 2008 to discuss these issues, as a result of this discussion the proposed process for including Fire and Rescue Capital needs in the CIP has been modified slightly. (The opinion received from Mr. Mitchell dated 1/8/08 is attached) Staff is now proposing that as part of the 2008 CIP, a single Fire and Rescue Capital Project line be added in the amount of one million dollars that would be a blanket amount aimed at addressing requests from individual companies to access proffered funds to pay for capital projects other than land for new stations or additions to existing stations which would be listed as separate items. By not listing individual equipment requests we would eliminate the need for the County to amend the CIP on the occasion where a request to access proffered funds for an equipment item not already listed was granted.

CIP Criteria

In a related matter, at your December meeting the Finance Committee again discussed the criteria to be used in determining what qualifies as a "capital project" for inclusion in the CIP. In the past staff had recommended a minimum value of \$100,000.00 and a useful life of at least five years. Fire and Rescue representatives have expressed some concern about the \$100,000.00 threshold, and suggested lowering the threshold amount to \$50,000.00.

The Planning staff has pointed out that the \$100,000 threshold for 'bricks-and-mortar' was intended to alleviate small scale, non capital projects from inclusion in the CIP (a historical problem we've encountered). The Department implemented a soft \$100,000 threshold (this year's CIP includes a

\$43,000 Parks and Rec. project that was left over after the original 'qualifying \$100,000' project was modified). Given that the intent is to accommodate F&R project requests for costly equipment, the Planning staff urges that we continue to utilize the \$100,000 threshold while recognizing that occasionally a Company may have a special project need which totals less than \$100,000. These occasional requests could be considered on a case-by-case basis. This approach, combined with utilizing a single one million dollar line in the CIP for all miscellaneous equipment needs as recommended above, should help to alleviate the Companies concern over this issue.

Proffers for Fire and Rescue

Dear Kris:

You have asked that I provide you with my legal opinion regarding the requirements for handling cash proffers for fire and rescue.

Virginia Code §15.2-2298(A) provides, in part:

"In the event that proffered conditions include the dedication of real property or payment of cash, the property shall not transfer and the payment of cash shall not be made until the facilities for which the property is dedicated or cash is tendered are included in the capital improvement program, provided that nothing herein shall prevent a locality from accepting proffered conditions which are not normally included in a capital improvement program."

In my opinion, this code section requires that before property to be dedicated is conveyed to the County, or before cash is paid to the County, the capital improvements for which the proffers were made must be included in the County capital improvement program (CIP). The clause at the end of the above-referenced

code section means, in my opinion, that proffered conditions can be accepted which are not normally included in the capital improvement program and which at the time of the acceptance of the proffer are not included in the capital improvement program, but before land proffered to be dedicated is actually conveyed, or before cash proffer is actually paid to the County, the subject capital improvement must be included in the capital improvement program.

It is my understanding that the County will be establishing guidelines as to what will constitute a capital expenditure to be included in the County CIP.

It is also my understanding that the County will establish a process for the respective fire companies to submit proposed capital improvements to be included in the CIP. As the County will establish separate accounts to hold proffered funds for respective fire and rescue companies, with respect to fire and rescue vehicles/equipment which qualify as a capital expenditure under the County guidelines I would recommend that this be covered in the CIP by a single entry along the lines of "additional and replacement fire and rescue vehicles/equipment". I believe such a single entry would meet the requirements of the code section to permit the County to accept cash proffers for fire and rescue to be used for qualifying vehicles/equipment, and would enable the County to be able to disburse proffered funds for qualifying vehicles/equipment.

In addition to the single entry for vehicle/equipment, separate entries in the CIP should be made for sites for new fire and rescue buildings, or for additions to existing buildings.

Please advise if there are any questions concerning the foregoing, or if I can provide any further information.

Ozone Action Coordinator Position

The EDC is seeking direction from the Board of Supervisors and City Council on the community's Ozone Early Action Plan.

For background, the City and County entered into an agreement with the Virginia Department of Environmental Quality on a proactive locally driven plan to address the issue of the community's ozone non-attainment in late 2003. Several control measures within the community's Ozone Early Action Plan centered on public awareness activities and communication. As such, an Ozone Action Coordinator Position Coordinator was hired in early 2005 to facilitate these activities. The SHENAIR Institute at James Madison University was awarded the contract (\$73,936) of the Ozone Action Coordinator Position for the past three years, which was the initial timeframe of the Ozone Early Action Plan.

The success of community efforts along with regional/state measures has achieved notable results. Since executing the Ozone Early Action Plan, our community has only experienced one (I) day of exceeding the ozone standard. This success will most likely bring a format determination of attainment for the current ozone standard in April 2008.

Several important caveats come along with this success. First, the Ozone Early Action Plan contains a condition that our community must remain vigilant and proactive in promoting its Ozone Early Action Plan and retaining air quality gains thru 2012. Second, and perhaps, more importantly, EPA is in the process of establishing a new and more stringent ozone standard that will be in place by 2010. Depending on the level selected, the area will again be close to, or back into, non-attainment status at that time. Virginia Department of Environmental Quality has commented that the continuation of the Ozone Early Action Plan process may benefit the community when EPA makes its area designation decisions.

To this effect, Board of Supervisors and City Council need to provide some direction/action on continued maintenance on the community's Ozone Early Action Plan. Staff has generated three options based on discussion with the Northern Shenandoah Valley Air Quality Taskforce, the EDC and the SHENAIR Institute at James Madison University. Those options are listed below.

- 1. Continue program, including contract with JMU at current level until 2012
 - The renewal costs with JUM would be \$79,851. Following previous costsharing of this contract, the City and County would split the cost equally, resulting in each entity providing \$39,925.
- 2. Continue program at reduced level until 2012 and absorb functions into EDC or other city/county department
 - Only programs identified as valuable (see below)
- 3. Cease all activities as soon as attainment status received

Both the Northern Shenandoah Valley Air Quality Taskforce and the EDC recommend the continuation of the program with a preference toward option 1.
