SUBJECT: Finance Committee Report and Recommendations

The Finance Committee met in the First Floor Conference Room at 107 North Kent Street on Wednesday, November 17, 2010 at 8:00 a.m. Member Richard Shickle was absent.

- 1. The NRADC Superintendent requests a <u>Court Services Fund supplemental</u> <u>appropriation in the amount of \$57,885</u> to cover the costs of unemployment claims (\$14,125), retiree healthcare (\$5,098) and funding to continue current operations of the Starting Point Public Inebriate Center (Detox) until June 30, 2011 (\$38,662). See attached memo, p. 1 3. The committee recommends approval.
- The NRADC Superintendent requests a <u>Court Services Fund supplemental</u>
 appropriation in the amount of \$30,091 to relocate Court Services Community
 Corrections and Alcohol Safety Action (ASAP) programs. See attached memo, p.
 4 10. The committee recommends approval.
- 3. The Sheriff requests the following <u>General Fund supplemental appropriation in</u> the amount of \$1,447.60. These funds represent payment from a FOIA request (\$400.60), a DARE fundraiser (\$547) and revenue for the use of the firing range

- (\$500). No local funds are needed. See attached memos, p. 11 13. The committee recommends approval.
- 4. The Sheriff requests a <u>General Fund supplemental appropriation in the amount</u> of \$77,687. This amount represents a carry forward of unspent grant funds. See attached information, p. 14 18. The committee recommends approval.
- 5. The Sheriff requests a <u>General Fund supplemental appropriation in the amount of \$2,500</u>. This amount represents a carry forward of grant funds for Internet Crimes Against Children. See attached memo, p. 19 22. The committee recommended approval of \$2,000 due to documentation not available at the meeting; however, \$2,500 is the appropriation needed.
- 6. The Finance Director requests a <u>General Fund supplemental appropriation in the amount of \$21,339.04</u> in order to return unspent VJCCCA FY2010 funds to the State. See attached letter, p. 23. The committee recommends approval.
- 7. The Winchester Regional Airport Director requests a <u>Fund 85 supplemental</u> <u>appropriation in the amount of \$140,000</u> for the acquisition of parcel 53 on Bufflick Road. See attached memo, p. 24. The committee recommends approval.
- 8. The Finance Committee Chairman requests discussion on the preparation of the FY 2012 budget. See attached memo, p. 25.

SUBJ:

Draw from Fund Balance for Payments to cover Unemployment Claims, Retiree Healthcare, and Operation of the Inebriate Center Thru June 30, 2011

Request that \$57,885 be appropriated from the Court Services Unreserved Fund Balance (Starting Point/Public Inebriate Center) for the following purposes.

- The transfer of \$14,125 is required to facilitate payment of two (2) anticipated unemployment claims through 30 June 2011 for employees released from the Inebriate Center. Funds should be applied to 021110-5810-000-000, Unemployment Claims.
- The transfer of \$5,098 is required to provide a one (1) retiree's healthcare as part of the County retirement benefit. Funds should be applied to 021110-2005-000-000, Hospital/Medical Plans.
- The transfer of \$38,662 is required to maintain the Inebriate Center at its current level of operations until 30 June 2011. Funds should be applied to:

Inebriate Center Update

November 10, 2010

- Operation of the Inebriate Center on a reduced scale between July 1 and September 30, 2010 was approved to allow for further development of a proposal to renovate the Northwestern Regional Education Program (NREP) building and partner with the Federal Bureau of Prisons (BOP) to operate a Halfway House at that location.
- A joint Halfway House venture with the BOP will permit operation of a revised, criminal
 justice-oriented Starting Point Program and fulltime operation of the Inebriate Center at
 little or no local cost.
- In August 2010, the proposal to operate a Halfway House for federal inmates at the NREP building was submitted to the BOP. In September, the BOP advised that they would solicit competitive bids for such a facility in the Northern Virginia area in the near future. To date, no solicitation has been announced.
- The architect's estimate to renovate the NREP building to BOP Halfway House standards and to accommodate relocation of the Inebriate Center is \$245,214. A formal solicitation for actual bids has been prepared.
- Since July 1, 2010, Starting Point closed and Inebriate Center hours were reduced to Friday thru Sunday. One permanent and one part time employee were retained. Use of the Inebriate Center was limited to those in law enforcement custody. Walk-ins are no longer accepted.
- Between July 1 and September 30, 2010 135 inebriates were delivered to the Inebriate Center (105 – Win; 2 - Clarke; 27 – Fred; 1 – VSP). 152 others were arrested and incarcerated during periods when the Inebriate Center was unavailable. The overall trend in inebriate law enforcement contacts is down.
- Use of the Inebriate Center in lieu of incarceration
 - Avoids mandatory court appearances and associated overtime for arresting officers:
 - Avoids the average 33 minutes law enforcement officers wait to process inebriates at the Magistrate window;
 - Diverts inebriates from already overloaded court dockets;
 - Helps in avoiding the need for additional staff at the Jail; and
 - Avoids potential for extensive emergency health care expenses at the Jail
- The cost to continue operation of the Inebriate Center through 30 June 2011 is \$38,662.

- Given the need for additional time to determine an appropriate course of action, recommend:
 - That the Finance Committee direct that bids for the renovation of the NREP building not be solicited pending further clarity of BOP intentions;
 - That the Finance Committee recommend the appropriation of \$38,662 from the Court Services Unreserved Fund Balance to operate the Inebriate Center through June 30, 2011; and
 - That the Finance Committee approve an increase of Inebriate Center user fees to \$94.62.

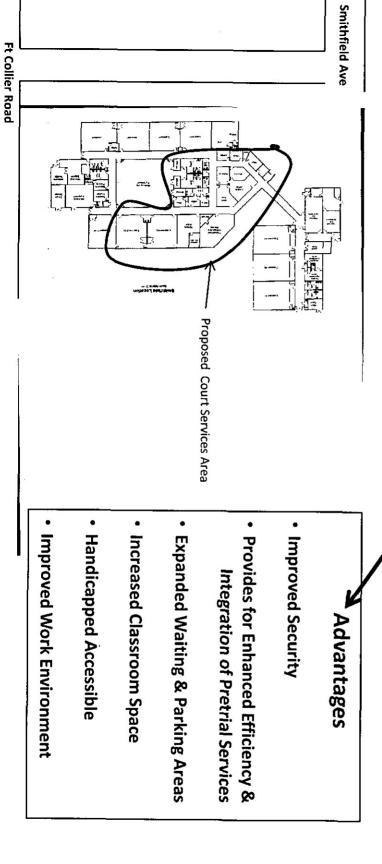

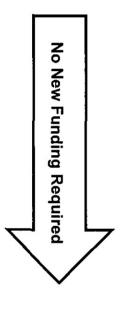

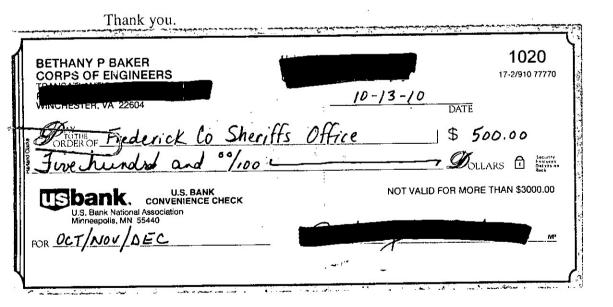

GRANT PROGRAM: FY 2010 ICAC Task Force Grant

WHEREAS, VSP is the recipient of a Federal grant through the United States
Department of Justice (DOJ), Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention
(OJJDP) to assist in the investigation and prosecution of Internet crimes against children; and

WHEREAS, VSP has been selected by OJJDP to oversee a multi-jurisdictional Northern Virginia – District of Columbia (NOVA/DC) Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) Task Force intended to combat crimes related to the sexual exploitation and victimization of children through the Internet, online communication systems, and other computer technology; and

WHEREAS, VSP will assist police agencies in the NOVA/DC Task Force increase their computer forensic capabilities and receive appropriate training to investigate Internet related cases; and

WHEREAS, two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500) of OJJDP grant funds have been earmarked for this purpose;

NOW THEREFORE, the parties hereto agree as follows:

This Interagency Agreement contains five (5) Articles.

ARTICLE I. TERM OF AGREEMENT

The term of this Interagency Agreement shall commence on July 28, 2010, and shall end on June 30, 2011, unless terminated earlier pursuant to the provisions hereof.

ARTICLE II: OBLIGATION OF OLIDP GRANT FUNDS

A total two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500) of OJJDP Federal grant funds have been earmarked for reimbursement of ICAC related expenses incurred by the Frederick County Sheriff's Office, an affiliate member of the NOVA/DC ICAC Task Force.

Funds are available for reimbursement consistent with the procedures outlined in Article III below.

ARTICLE III: REIMBURSEMENT

- 1. The Frederick County Sheriff's Office shall continue to actively participate in the NOVA/DC ICAC Task Force, which is overseen by the Virginia State Police as the primary grantee.
- 2. All expenditures shall be approved by Captain Kirk S. Marlowe, Virginia State Police, PO Box 27472, Richmond, VA 23261. (Only equipment, supplies, software, formalized training specifically related and dedicated to ICAC operations/investigations and overtime payments to ICAC assigned investigators can be approved.) Captain Marlowe shall maintain a record of all approved reimbursement requests, including the balance of available funds. Such declining balance shall be used to determine funding approval. Reimbursement shall be through Inter-Agency Transfer (IAT) from the Department of State Police to the Frederick County Sheriff's Office.
- 3. Two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500) is the total maximum amount available to the Frederick County Sheriff's Office under this agreement.
- 4. All reimbursement requests shall be accompanied by original receipts for expenditures and a properly executed invoice that is signed by the officer or officers executing this Interagency Agreement or his/her designee, and shall be submitted to Captain Kirk S. Marlowe, Virginia State Police, PO Box 27472, Richmond, VA 23261 or his designee.

ARTICLE IV. OPERATIONAL STANDARDS and REPORTING

The Frederick County Sheriff's Office agrees to adhere to the ICAC Task Force Program Operational and Investigative Standards, attached to and made part of this Agreement, as Attachment A. The Prederick County Sheriff's Office agree to investigate ICAC cases within their jurisdiction, assist other jurisdictions in investigating such cases where appropriate, conduct investigations stemming from Cyber Tips generated by the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC) and conduct internet safety training as requested by entities within their jurisdiction.

Pursuant to the 2008 PROTECT ACT; the Frederick County Sheriff's Office will utilize the Case Tracker reporting form developed by OJJDP to provide certain case information on a quarterly basis, to the VSP for compilation on a task force basis and submission to OJJDP. The purpose of said reporting is for program measurement and evaluation and justification for future funding.

Frederick County Sheriff's Office shall maintain accurate records pertaining to prevention, education and enforcement activities, to be collected and forwarded not less than monthly to Captain Kirk S. Marlowe, Virginia State Police, PO Box 27472, Richmond, VA 23261 or his designee, for statistical reporting purposes (form provided.)

ARTICLE V. AMENDMENTS

No modification or amendment of the provisions hereof shall be effective unless documented in writing and signed by authorized representatives of the parties hereto.

We are at that time of year preparing for the county's 2011-12 budget. Conditions have not changed much regarding the down economy and county revenues, so again this year, preparation of the budget will be a very trying and difficult job. Any assistance this committee and the Board of Supervisors can provide to our staff will be helpful.

It is getting late in the process so it is important for this committee to discuss budget issues at our November meeting with follow-up at future meetings. To assist us, I have asked staff to be prepared to inform us on the current status of revenue trends, fund balance, state support, and other conditions they see affecting the budget. With the re-assessment of real estate just completed, we are faced with a reduction of approximately \$3,500,000.00 in real estate revenue. With this loss of tax dollars, it is even more important that this committee provide direction in areas such as tax rates, employee salaries and positions, usage of fund balance, reductions in county programs, etc.

Conditions affecting the current year budget included increasing the personal property tax rate to \$4.86, done in calendar year 2009 and continues to be the rate in place, in order for tax revenue to remain neutral. Other tax rates were no changed. Other actions included the utilization of \$4,300,000.00 from fund balance, across the board expenditure reductions, no employee salary increases, and vacant positions frozen.

Preparation of the past two budgets was not an easy task. This year will be no different with the down economy, tax payers losing their homes and jobs, and the loss of real estate tax values. It will be difficult to recommend an increase to the real estate tax rate; however, it might require some consideration, not to exceed revenue neutral. Once again, we can utilize some of our fund balance and possibly maintain status quo regarding positions, salaries, and the funding of programs and services. I would like to see consideration given to providing employees some form of incentives along with the reinstatement of the employees' awards banquet recognizing the employees for their importance to the County. I would also like staff to prepare budget scenarios reflecting a low scenario of no tax rate increases and other scenarios not exceeding the utilization of revenue neutral real estate taxes. Your input of other options and thoughts are very important so please be prepared to offer them to the committee and staff at our November meeting. I welcome any member of the Board of Supervisors to participate in the discussions.
